<b>Credited voters in EMS</b>	15300	<i>Write Explanation Here</i> Two ballots in one envelope were discovered after the ballots were separated from the outer envelope. Per WAC 434-262-031 (2b), "Where two voted ballots are returned together: (i) If the two ballots are returned with only one valid signature on the ballot declaration, the races and measures voted the same on both ballots may be counted once." Clallam County Elections opening boards are instructed to immediately interrupt ballot processing when they encounter a ballot return envelope containing two ballots. Such ballots are then to be processed according to WAC 434-262-031. However, in the 2015 Primary Election one additional ballot was not discovered until the ballots were recounted in the scanning stage. At that point, it was impossible to determine the origin of the additional ballot. It was therefore counted as a valid ballot, without attribution to a specific voter.			<b>Ballots Received</b>	15509
