My comments for the Clallam County Commissioners

My name is Pearl Rains Hewett

I am the Trustee of the George C. Rains Sr. Trust

At this time our family Trusts own 900 acres of land in Clallam County

Collectively our family has owned and paid taxes on up to 3000 acres of land in this county for over 60 years.

At the Jan. 26th 2011 focus meeting on the updating of the Shoreline Master Program for Clallam County we were **directed** to focus on 2 things.

Are things better or worse? and how to get people to participate.

When 30 people are invited and 60 people show up, you know that there is not a problem with participation.

My Dad, George Rains Sr. told me that public meeting were only held to satisfy legal requirements. That the outcome had already been decided.

Since that focus meeting I have spent over 70 hours researching the updating of the Shoreline Master Program in Washington State. (now I have spent 20 MONTHS researching)

I read the entire Port Townsend updated Shoreline Master program provided on line.

I took notes on the most offensive Restrictions, Regulations, Mitigation requirements and Enforcement policies.

If the Clallam County updated Shoreline Master Program turns out to be anything like the one in Port Townsend? My conclusion is that any private property owner that lives within 150 feet of a mud puddle has reason to be concerned.

Affected private property owners, should be focusing on the power that has been given by the state, to the State Dept of Ecology and to **the power we have given to our elected county officials.**

Our family Trusts have a dozen or more shorelines, rivers, creeks, streams, surface water and **wet lands** that will be affected by the updating of the Shoreline Management Program.

I would personally like to know, when the Clallam County Commissioners are going to attend a public meeting to answer our questions and to address our issues and concerns on the updating of the Master Shoreline Program in Clallam County?

My second comment was about the old people from **Lake Sutherland at the Jan. 26, 2011** focus meeting, that they were not concerned citizens, that **they were fearful of what their government was going to do to them.** The financial problems related to nonconforming property, the official white boats taking pictures of their docks and homes from every angle. Those old people were fearful and didn't know what to do.
