Dear Mr. Gray:

I represent Olympic Climate Action, a local group of 300+ members who understand the threat of climate change and are working to ensure a safe, prosperous and sustainable future in Clallam County.

In reviewing the Shoreline Master Plan list of Supporting Documents we note that the *Jamestown S'Klallam Tribe Climate Vulnerability Assessment and Adaptation Plan* (Jamestown Plan, [http://www.jamestowntribe.org/programs/nrs/nrs\\_climchg.htm](http://www.jamestowntribe.org/programs/nrs/nrs_climchg.htm)) is not referenced.

The Jamestown Plan is the only current local study completed to date detailing the impacts of climate change and the strategies available to reduce these impacts. Included in the study is a review, using current scientific information, of projected sea level rise and coastal flooding. The Jamestown Plan is an important source of information and critical to developing a meaningful shoreline plan. Can you explain to us why the Jamestown Plan has not been included in the planning for Shoreline Master Plan development? Can this omission be corrected?
