



RULES AND REGULATIONS

Read the rules and regulations before making a reservation or visiting Clallam County Dungeness and Salt Creek Recreation Areas. Each park system operates under different rules and it's best to be acquainted with them beforehand.

The following policies apply to Dungeness and Salt Creek Recreation Areas:

1. **No alcoholic beverages or marijuana allowed in Clallam County parks per State laws RCW 66.44.100; RCW.69.50.445.** Non-compliance may lead to a citation, eviction, and/or no future park access.
2. Pets must remain on a leash, no longer than eight (8) feet, and under control at all times. Pet handlers must remove and properly dispose of all waste from pets. (C.C.C. 23.03.070)
3. No fireworks are allowed in the park. (C.C.C. 23.03.080)
4. Hunting or the use of firearms, bow and arrow, air or gas weapon, or other projectile devices capable of injuring or killing any person or animal or damaging or destroying any park property is prohibited. (C.C.C. 23.03.090)
5. Persons under 18 years of age must be accompanied by a parent or guardian to camp overnight. (C.C.C. 23.03.040)
6. **There is a maximum of six (6) people allowed per campsite. The Dungeness Recreation Area Hiker/Biker campsites are limited to one (1) person per site.**
7. Only one (1) self-contained camping vehicle allowed per campsite.
8. One (1) extra vehicle is allowed per campsite for a daily fee, to be paid at the Park.
9. To show occupancy, a vehicle or tent must remain in the campsite at all times. If you plan to leave the campsite during your reservation period, make certain the campsite appears occupied.
10. Wood fires are permitted within the fire ring only. No fire shall be left unattended nor allowed to extend beyond the capacity of the fire ring. **NO FIREWOOD GATHERING. NO BEACH FIRES.** (C.C.C. 23.03.100)
11. Quiet hours are from 10:00p.m.—8:00a.m. Generator quiet hours are 9:00p.m.—8:00a.m. *Noise shall not emit past the assigned campsite, **this includes generators.*** (C.C.C. 23.03.030)
12. Do not place grills or other hot appliances on picnic tables.
13. All visitors not camping overnight must leave the park before the gate closes. Gate hours are posted at the park entrance. Gate is not to be opened unless leaving due to an emergency.
14. Check out time is 12:00 noon.
15. The ADA accessible campsites are designated for use by patrons displaying the state issued license plate or blue and white disability placard.
16. It shall be within the authority of the Park Manager, or their representative, to remove from the Park any or all members of a group whose behavior, at any time, conflicts with County rules or State laws, becomes detrimental to the health and safety of the group or other Park users, and/or becomes so unruly as to affect the reasonable enjoyment of other Park users.
