WHO WE ARE

The Volunteers in Medicine of the Olympics Clinic provides primary medical, mental health care, and referrals for dental care to adults who live, work or visit on the Olympic Peninsula and do not have access to health care.

SERVICES OFFERED

We are providers of **ADULT** general medicine, and our services include:

- Physical examinations
- Treatment of acute and chronic illness
- Health screening and health education
- Hypertension/blood pressure check
- Smoking cessation
- Diagnostic tests
- Prescriptions
- Physical therapy
- Diabetic testing and education

CLINIC STAFFING

Medical providers are state licensed and volunteer their time. The clinic is fully staffed by volunteers.

CLINIC HOURS

The Clinic is open Monday 12:00 to 5:00 pm and Thursday 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm for walk-in patients but appointments are encouraged and will be seen ahead of walk-in patients. Please call 360 457 4431 during clinic hours for further information.

REFERRALS

We make referrals to appropriate specialists. You may be responsible for some payment. However, some services will be referred to other providers or agencies in the community:

- Children will usually be referred to the Peninsula Children's Clinic.
- Immunization requests will be referred to Clallam County Health Department
- Obstetrics will be referred to local providers
- Mental health issues will be referred to Peninsula Community Mental Health

LABORATORY WORK AND X-RAYS

- You will be referred to Olympic Medical Center for most lab tests and x-rays.
- Results are usually available within 24 hours or on the next clinic open day. You may be responsible for payment for some types of services.

APPOINTMENTS

- We will see patients by appointment – call during clinic days to schedule an appointment.
- If medically necessary, patients without an appointment will be worked in as soon as possible.
- If not medically necessary, patients without an appointment may be scheduled for a future appointment.

PAYMENT

While the Clinic does not charge for services, we ask that those of you who are able, to please make a donation so that we may continue to offer these services and keep the clinic open.
