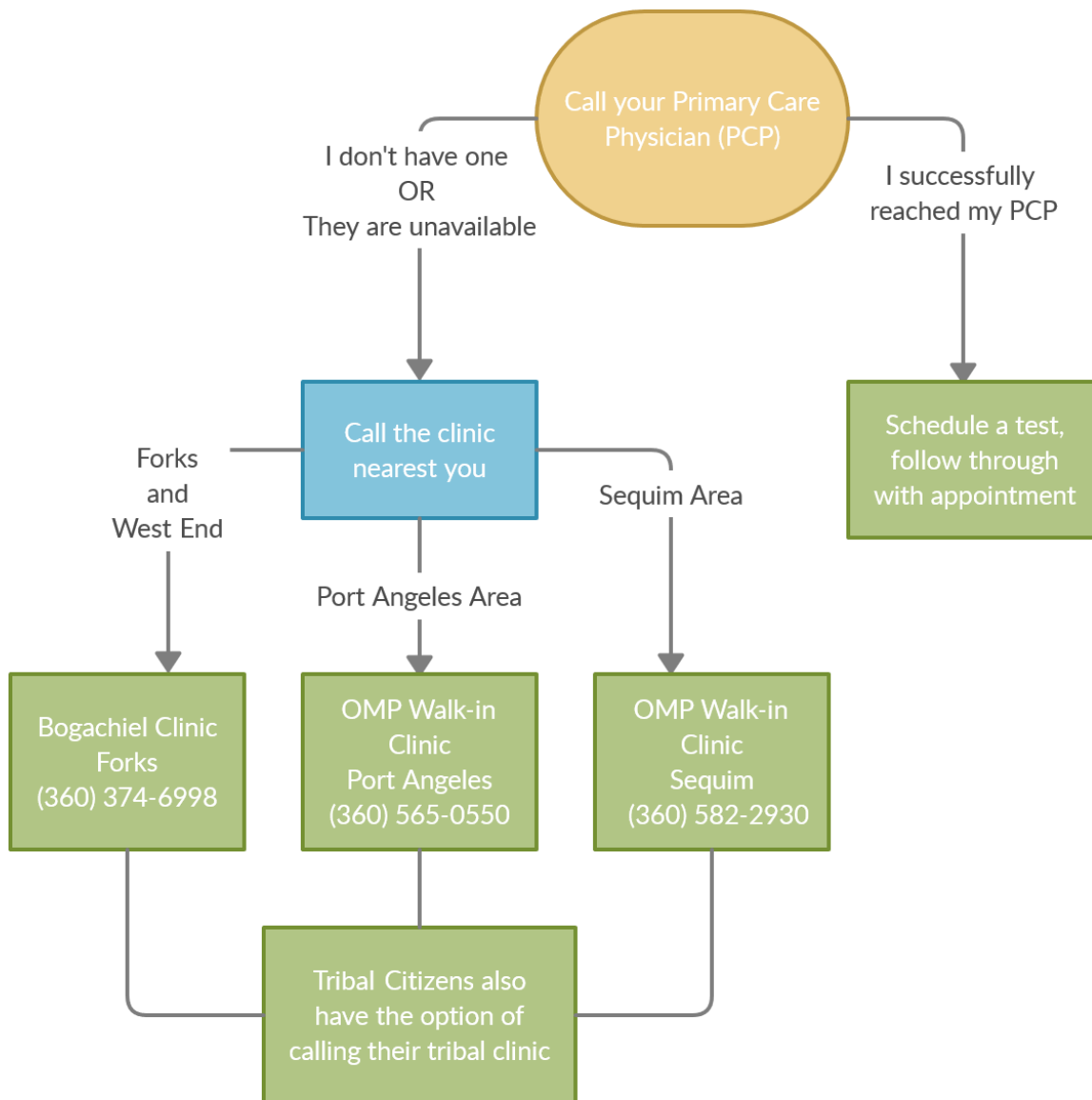


How to Get Tested



Frequently Asked Questions

Who pays for testing? Your insurance will completely cover the cost of testing. If you do not have insurance, the test will be provided free of charge.

What happens if I test positive? If you test positive, you will be asked to stay home (isolate) until 10 days after your symptoms started or 10 days after your test if you have no symptoms at all. You can expect to receive a call from the health department within 24 hours after you are told your test results. The health department staff will check in on how you are doing and make sure you have what you need to safely isolate at home. They will ask you questions about who you've been around in recent days so that anyone who was exposed to the virus can be notified. Your information will be kept strictly confidential. The health department staff will also answer any questions you may have about COVID-19.
